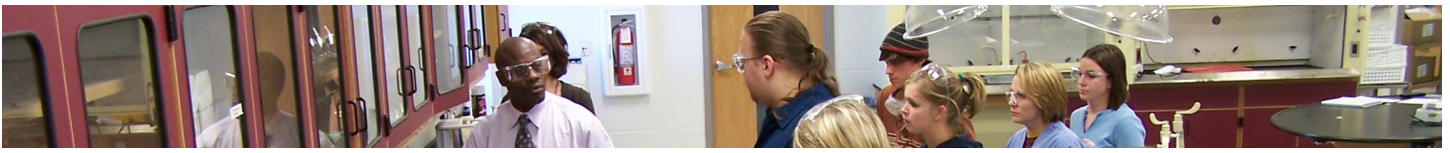
In 2009-2010, over \$24 million dollars in Financial Aid was awarded to Vol State students.

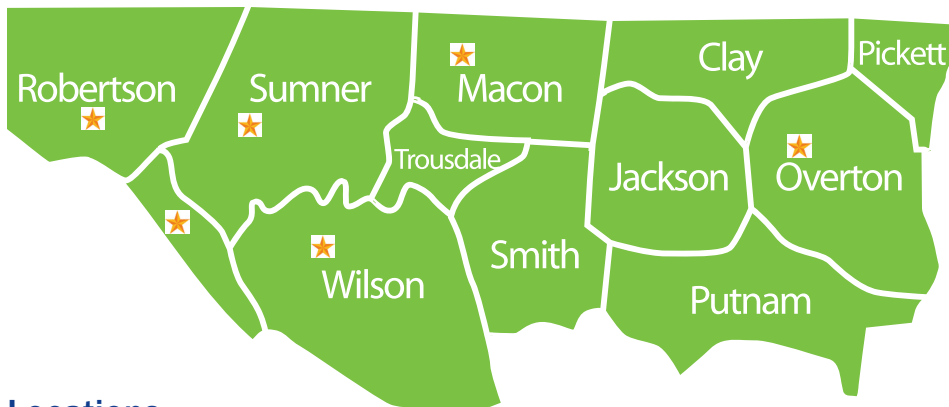
### Vol State News

- Vol State received TBR initial funding approval, and began a community fund raising campaign, to build a new Allied Health building on the Gallatin campus, featuring: an anatomy and physiology lab, tiered classrooms, three simulation labs and two monitored computer labs.

## Community Partnerships

The Tennessee Small Business Development Center at Vol State worked with 210 businesses in 2010 for a capital formation of \$1,183,500.

Professional musicians are partnering with Vol State on a number of bluegrass classes in Continuing Education. The college also holds jam sessions on campus for musicians and fans.

The Celebration of the Arts is a community festival scheduled for the weekend of April 14-17, 2011 on the Vol State campus. Music, dance, theater and visual art are just a few of the highlights of this grant partnership with the Tennessee Arts Commission.

The Avancemos Juntos grant program, conducted by the college, reached 559 Hispanic middle and high school students in 2010 and 2011, and had follow-up meetings and one-on-one advising with parents and family members. The goal is to inform the community about the college-going process.
