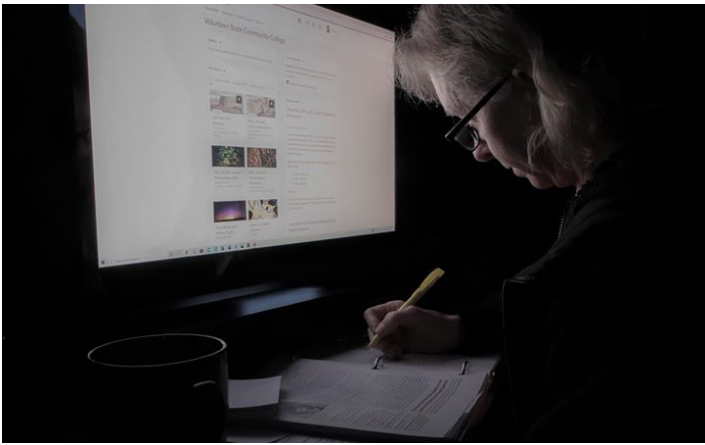

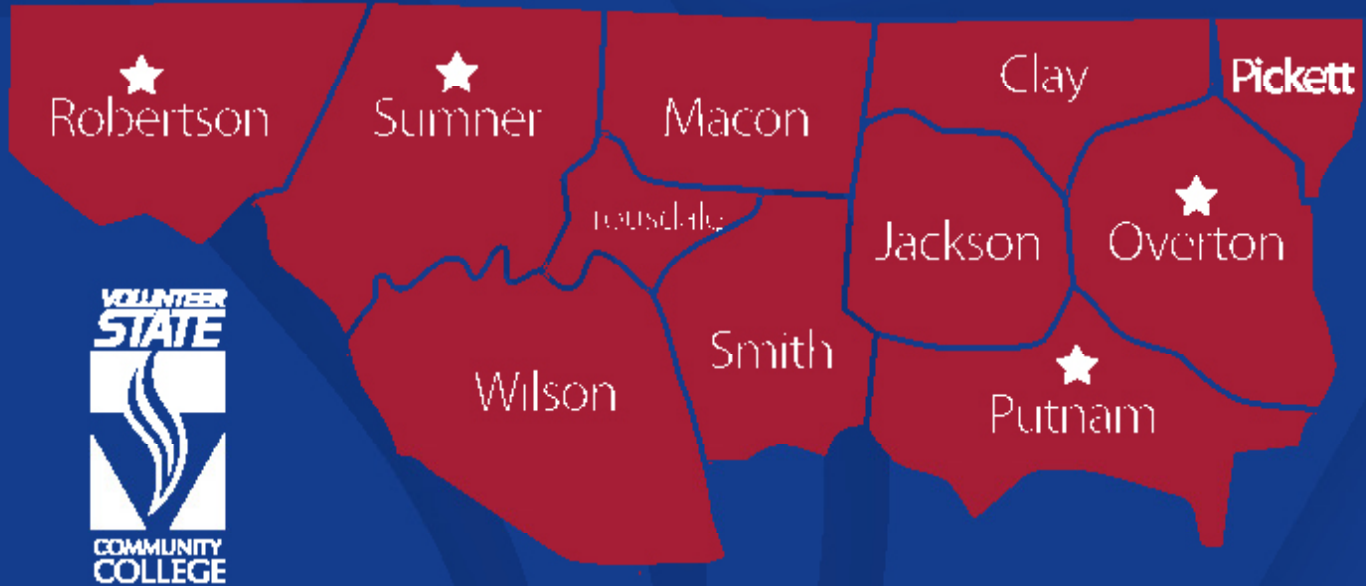
### Vol State News
