Health Sciences Division (HSD) Advising Nuances

*Students intending to apply for a competitive admissions HSD program are placed in the following "holding place" degree (i.e., major) until official program admission:

Health Sciences, AS

*Students may also have their <u>intended program listed in parenthesis</u> after the "holding place" degree; for example:

Health Sciences, AS (Dental Assisting)

- *Students **DO NOT** need to take all the courses listed in their "holding place" degree **unless they plan to transfer** to a 4-yr. college or university. For example, most students do not need to take the following courses: ENGL 1020, ENGL LIT, HIST, etc.
- *Students <u>need to review/read</u> the following information to understand the requirements for admission to their intended program:

 - 2. Intended Program's Webpage (Programs are listed in a column on the left-hand side of the computer screen. Once the program is selected, there will also be sub-points listed for review under the program name in the column listing.)
 - 3. Intended Program's Information Packet (Each program has a sub-point for their own Information Packet; however, the following link is a webpage that lists links for all of the HSD programs: https://www.volstate.edu/academics/health-sciences/information-packets)

*Students can run a <u>What-If Report in Degree Works</u> (DW) for their <u>intended AAS degree</u> <u>program</u> to see what courses are truly needed (i.e., pre-requisite courses) for their intended program. Guidelines when Selecting a Degree Works Plan

1. If the student <u>needs Learning Support (LS)</u> in any or all subjects (Reading, Writing, and/or Math), the plan you select <u>will be listed as Health Sciences</u>, <u>not their intended program</u>. For example, a Fall (FA) 2023 starting-student who intends to apply for the RAD TECH program with the following DSPs (DSPR=4, DSPW=4, DSPM=2) will need to have the following plan selected:

(FA) Health Sciences AS (LS-M) 2023-2024

2. If the student is <u>college-level ready</u> (DSPs = 4 in all 3 subjects: <u>Reading, <u>Writing</u>, and <u>Math</u>), the plan you select will be the <u>Pre-Acceptance Intended Program</u> plan. For example, a Fall 2023 starting student who intends to apply for the RAD TECH program with the following DSPs (DSPR=4, DSPW=4) will need to have the following plan selected:</u>

(FA) Pre-Acceptance Radiologic Technology (No LS) 2023-2024

IMPORTANT ADVISING TIP: Encourage them to be thinking about a Plan B in case they are not admitted to their intended program.
