## **“MURDER IN MUSIC CITY”**

**Friday, September 13, 2019 9:15am-12:00pm**

***Presented by Michael Bishop, Author***

This session explores Metro Nashville's first big murder case from February 1964, an infamous babysitter murder that took place on a cold February night. A judge's son from East Tennessee was convicted of the slaying that same year. Decades later a private citizen stumbles upon a hidden crime scene folder for the murder and embarks upon a multi-decade journey which ends with the discovery that the judge's son was innocent and powerful citizens in Nashville were the real culprit.

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## **“NORMAL AGING/NOT AGING”**
