ACCUPLACER Instructions for Prospective District Collaborative Students

These instructions are for prospective District Collaborative students who do not have a 3.6 high school GPA or the required minimum ACT scores (English 18, Reading 19, Math 19). The District Collaborative will also accept ACCUPLACER results for academic placement.

What is the ACCUPLACER?

The ACCUPLACER is a series of tests that evaluate students' skills in reading, writing, and math to help college administrators place them in courses that match their skills. The ACCUPLACER is untimed, but typically takes about 30 minutes per test (estimated 1.5 hours for the full exam).

What minimum scores do I need on the ACCUPLACER to meet the academic eligibility requirements for the District Collaborative?
