



Connecting Assessment to eLearn


- 1. Login to your eLearn account.
- 2. Open the course shell you wish to link the assessment activity.


5. From the Outcome Assessment Activities click the **Add Existing Activity** drop down menu and choose External Learning Tools:


8. Once the new window opens, click the **Specific Activity** button - (If this is your first time you will need to accept the terms and conditions).

Select the specific Watermark Student Learning & Licensure Activity to which you would like to direct students. You may only select from published Activities.






5. Click on the individual student name that you would like to begin scoring.




6. Click on the View Rubric Details hyperlink, to the right under Assessment Panel.
